

International Day of Women and Girls in Science The United Nations have proclaimed February 11 the International Day of Women and Girls in Science aiming to ensure full and equal access to and participation in science for women and girls.

"On this International Day, I urge commitment to end bias, greater investments in science, technology, engineering and math education for all women and girls as well as opportunities for their careers and longer-term professional advancement so that all can benefit from their ground-breaking future contributions," said UN Secretary-General, António Guterres. The resolution was adopted by the UN General Assembly on December 22, 2015. According to a UN study from 14 countries, the probability for female students

graduating with a Bachelor's degree in science is 18%, while the male equivalent is 37%. The resolution states that women continue to be excluded from participating fully in the economy even though representing half of the world's population and that women have a vital role to play and a right to participate in sustainable development policies, programs, and decision-making at all levels.
